Fog at 1,600' at 7am, mostly burned off by noon. Spotty cirrus clouds, mare's tails, SE wind. Clear air. 80° at 12:30pm.

Mike Myers visits.

Saturday 28 June 1986

Clear on coast, light breeze. A few cirrus. Connie McCoy hikes up, arrives at 7:30am, photographs cabin. Gone by noon.

² This is not the Soberanes Creek in Garrapata State Park, but the creek in Soberanes Canyon, between Lime and Dolan creeks on the South Coast

Warm in afternoon

Saw what looked like a white winged red-tailed hawk soaring with a normal red tail in McWay, above lower forks. Connie saw it too.

Sunday 29 June 1986

A little patchy fog up to 1,000' around Big Creek, burning off by noon. SE breeze. Some cirrus.

To Staude's for lunch with Tom, Marguirite, Mike Caplin, Greg & Susan Hawthorne, and his parents, Gersh & Clement.

Arrive here at 7pm.

Warm day.

Monday 30 June 1986

A good SE breeze – no fog on coast, and some thick high cirrus in far SE. Mild temp.

Some low fog far offshore in PM.

Tuesday 1 July 1986

Clear sky, light breeze, low fog front moving toward coast from west.

To Kaye's, who's gone, to visit Charlotte, pick up "solar shower". See Doug & John, back here by 6pm.

Wednesday 2 July 1986

Fog on coast up to 800' at 8am, lowering to 300' and becoming patchy after noon. Warm temp.

To Harry Dick Ross's, meet Nancy H., Bill & Barbara Spring, who are taking some of Harry Dick Ross's wood blocks. I take a few items, phone insulators, green rose cutting, etc. Meet Anne McGowen for lunch in Carmel, meet with Brian & Zad Leavy, then with Anne until 7pm. Back here by 11pm.

Thursday 3 July 1986

Warm this AM. Light SE breeze, fog on coast up to 300', burning off by 11am. Puffy little thunderhead front in SE in AM, some clouds with virga. Wind comes out of the north after noon, 86° at 3pm.

Friday 4 July 1986

Much cooler today, gusty winds from SE, up to 30 mph. Clear on coast, no clouds above, but hazy air.

To Kaye's for brush clearing, dinner.

Back here by 10:30.

Esther has 3rd litter in early AM hours.

Saturday 5 July 1986

Cooler than yesterday, steady SE wind, 5-10 mph. Fog on coast up to 1,600' at 7am, burning off by 9:30, but air stays hazy. Large mass of cumulus cloud on Gamboa Ridge. As morning progresses, fog layer forms as far north as upper Post Ranch, and by noon a solid layer of cloud, with ceiling at 3,000'. Cone Pk. reports top of cloud at 4,000'. Fog on coast at 300' at 5pm, with high fog and some cirrus above that.

Chopped weeds around cabin.

Sunday 6 July 1986

Cabin socked in at 7am with clouds slowly rising so that by noon the ceiling is at 3,000'. Mild temp. Warmer than yesterday, but I have fire at breakfast. South wind continues. Two golden eagles and two red tails fight. Leave here for dinner at Kaye's, Stewarts, Catherine Short & Douglas, Baylisses, Charro & David, Toni, Springs.

Arrive here at 1:30am. No fog.

Anniversary of start of Rat Creek Fire.

Monday 7 July 1986

Fog on coast up to 1,400' in AM, burning off by 11am. Some mare's tails in AM, turning to puffy low cumulus in afternoon. Mild temps., with light north breeze all day. Fog starts forming again by 6pm.

Earthquake around 5:30pm today, strongly felt on Cone Pk., lesser magnitude elsewhere on coast; Pfeiffer Pt., Plaskett, etc., but not felt here. 4.4 Richter, center off coast 33 miles south of Monterey.

Tuesday 8 July 1986

Light north breeze, warmer today. Fog on coast up to 1,200'. No clouds above, but air is hazy. 6.0 earthquake in Palm Springs at 2:15am; some damage there and Hemet and Perris. Not felt here.

To hiway, to Kaye's, make phone calls, news about water rights, etc. See Judith for lunch at Pfeiffer Beach. Back here by 4:30pm.

Fog burns off by noon.

Wednesday 9 July 1986

Foggy on coast to 1,000' all day. Gusty SE breeze, but hot. Cut some grass around house.

Thursday 10 July 1986

Foggy on coast to 1,400', light north wind in AM, becoming gusty to 30 mph in late afternoon. Fog burns off by 2pm, except for a few patches at Big Creek. Hot afternoon.

Worked on Sunshine Springs.

Fog comes back in by sunset. Some cirrus clouds thru day.

Anniversary of the Rat Fire's defeat on this ridge. (Fought from mid-day 7-10-85 to mid-day 7-11-85)

Friday 11 July 1986

Foggy on coast to 600', light breeze from SE. No clouds, clear air. Hot temp. - 90° at 10:30am (74° at 7am).

To hiway, see Kaye at library, to town, talk to Zad, etc., then dinner with Kaye (her 78th birthday), David, Burt, etc.

Back here by midnight.

Saturday 12 July 1986

Foggy on coast to 2,000', clearing around 3-4pm, then back at 2,000' later. Gusty SE breeze all day.

Connected 2nd spring into system – from approximately 1gpm to ca. 4gpm. Two trips to spring.

Sunday 13 July 1986

Fog on coast to 1,600'. No clouds, clear air. Gusty SE winds to 30 mph. 73° at noon. Warmer than yesterday, but not much. Winds continue all day, decreasing after 7pm. Cool in evening until wind stops. Partial clearing of fog by 2pm, mostly gone by 5pm, then moving back in to 1,400' by sunset.

Monday 14 July 1986

Fog on coast to 1,200'. Light SE breeze, much warmer than yesterday. Line of high cirrus in SE, clear air.

To library to fill in for Kaye, then dinner with her. Back here by midnight.

Nancy H. brings Green Rose cutting to library, which she'd kept for week or so. "Brought up the green rose cutting today."

Tuesday 15 July 1986

Foggy on coast to 1,800'. Warm temp. when I leave at noon.

To Harry Dick Ross's to help move desk, table, stove, etc. to Coast Gallery, then to Gallery by 3 to assist at auction, from 5 to 7pm. Lots of people there, made 4900 for Ross. Fog clears by 8pm. Dinner with Doug & Jim. Back here at 1am. Much colder above fog than previous.

Wednesday 16 July 1986

Much cooler today, fog on coast in early AM, but burning off by 8. Hazy air, light west wind in AM, then from SE during day, and from the north after 6pm.

Thursday 17 July 1986

High fog to 2,200' at 8am, engulfing cabin by 10am. Cool, wind light from north. Janet, at Petkus property, says white bird seen 6/28 is a red-tailed hawk.

Friday 18 July 1986

Clear on coast. Warmer than yesterday here. To hiway for phone calls at Kaye's. Back here by 6pm.

Saturday 19 July 1986

Clear on coast, warm here. SE breeze. No clouds. To hiway to attend Big Sur Historical Society meeting at New Camaldoli. Went with Kaye and another student, Charley

Johnson. Found out Judith broke wrist, in hospital after scooter wreck on Pfeiffer Ridge. Walter has cancer. Buster Grave died last night. When we returned to Kaye's for dinner, found Butano bust had been "cleaned" by friend of David's. Possibly ruined. A strange day. Back here by 1am.

Sunday 20 July 1986

Clear on coast, almost no wind, but light from north. Clear sky, clear air. Hot temp. 92° at 3pm. Some fog begins to form at 800' around Big Creek/Hot Springs. Strong earthquake felt in Bishop this AM.

Monday 21 July 1986

29.72 at 9am

Fog on coast to 300', south breeze, warm temp. 84° at 10am. Gentle rolling earthquake felt here at 7:45am, moving oil in lamps. 6.2 earthquake centered near Bishop. Many homes destroyed in Chalfant Valley. Felt in Salt Lake City.

Cloud front in south moving in after 10-11am, covering sky with thick high cirrocumulus by 4pm. Fog burns off by 6pm. Wind is quite gusty, up to 30 mph by 2pm. Wind subsides after sunset. Overcast thru night.

Tuesday 22 July 1986

Fog on coast to 1,800' at 7am, rising to cabin elevation by 9am, then lowering. The fog evaporates and reforms several times thru AM. Thick cirro-cumulus above, with sun coming through now and then. Rain reported from Willow Creek to Lopez Pt. at 9:30am. No rain here. Moderate south wind, wet smell.

To town, groceries, Anne. Dinner at Sam & Eby's, with Burt T., Vieregges, Judith; the cast for Angúlo reading in September. Perry H. also.

Stove fire this AM.

Wednesday 23 July 1986

.03

High fog up to 2,600', cabin in and out until fog burns off around 9am. Lots of cumulus and cirrus above that. Large cumulus mass to sea in south, which moves in to coast by 10:30, with 10 minutes of rain, very heavy at first. 2-3 close thunder claps over the sea. Rain over by 11, then temp. warms up. Scattered cumulus throughout rest of day. North wind after 2pm. Beautiful cumulus sunset.

Charlie Johnson interviews me for UCSC/BSHS here. Green Pea got .10" today. Fire in stove all day.

Thursday 24 July 1986

Low fog to 200-300' on coast, with lots of cirrus and some cirro-cumulus at 6,000'. Light south breeze. Mild temp., hazy air. Fog burns off by 2pm, wind coming from north after 4pm. Cumulus puffs on Coast Ridge after noon, spreading thru sky after 4pm. Fire in stove all day.

Friday 25 July 1986

Patchy fog and lots of cumulus moving over sky from south at 6am. By 9am, very little cumulus, but lots of thick cirrus. Fog thickens and thins thru AM, level staying around 2,000'. Little fog in mid-day, then it thickens up in afternoon, rising up to 3,000' by 5pm.

Cabin socked in 5-8pm, with occasional thinning. Fog level drops to 2,400' by 8:30pm. 68° at 2pm, wind mostly from the SE all day, occasionally from the north. No cirrus at 8:30pm. Fire in stove all day.

Saturday 26 July 1986

Fog up to 2,000' at 8am, receding thru the day to 1,400', then burns off by 4pm. Fog moves back in by 7pm. Wind from the west. Some puffy cumulus over mountains in midday. Warmer than yesterday. Stove fire all day, baked bread. Shoveled out barn.

Sunday 27 July 1986

Fog up to 2,000' at 8am. West wind. Warmer today, no stove fire. 84° at noon. Slightly hazy air, some cirrus in SE. Fog burns off, mostly, by 3pm, then reforms by sunset.

Cleaned up the shop.

Monday 28 July 1986

Fog on coast up to 2,000'. Solid at 7am. Beginning to burn off by 9am. 62° at 7am, but warm later. Light SE breeze. No clouds, air clearer than yesterday.

To hiway to make phone calls. Back here by 6pm.

Tuesday 29 July 1986

No fog on coast. Warmer than yesterday here.

To hiway and to town with Kaye. Title Company, Anne McGowan, visit David & Charro on Junipero St., buy new boots, groceries. Dinner at Kaye's, visit D & J, back here by 2:30am. Fog rolls in on coast at midnight.

Wednesday 30 July 1986

Fog on coast to 300'. Wind from SE in AM. Hot temp. 84° at 11am. Wind from north after 4pm, cooler temps. Air fairly clear.

Thursday 31 July 1986

Fog on coast to 500'. Wind from the SE. Hazy air, hot temp. Pocket of clear coast forms between Partington and Pfeiffer Pt. after noon. Fog moves back in there by sunset. Cirrus clouds move in from west after 10am, moving over sky in PM, but only in west at sunset. Light NW breeze after 7pm, temp. 90° at 4pm. Air clearer in afternoon. 79° at 8:15pm.

Friday 1 August 1986

Foggy on coast to 800'. To town, see partners, mail stuff to Cinnie, talk to Brian & Anne on phone. Call Dad.

Back here by 9pm.

Saturday 2 August 1986

Foggy on coast all day. Hot here. Hazy air.

Sunday 3 August 1986

Fog on coast to 800'. Very hot here. 90°'s thru the afternoon. Partial clearing on coast near Coastlands in afternoon. Solid fog on coast by sunset. Hazy air.

Monday 4 August 1986

Fog up to 1,000' in AM. Hot up here. To hiway for phone calls, talk to Pat, Brian. Dinner at Nepenthe with Kaye. Fog burns off north of Partington in afternoon, comes back in by sunset. See Doug & John later. Back here by midnight.

Tuesday 5 August 1986

Fog up to 1,200' all day. Hot temp. SE breeze in AM. Wind from NW after noon. Hazy air.

Wednesday 6 August 1986

Fog up to 1,600'. Warm temp. Light SE breeze. Clearer air than yesterday. To Kaye's for phone calls. To town, lots of time with Anne McGowen, Lee, Brian, do shopping. Meet Judith, have dinner, then rehearsal for Angúlo reading at Vieregge's. See D & J, later. Back here by 2am.

Thursday 7 August 1986

Hot day, fog up to 1,400'-1,600'. Lots of flies and no-see-ums.

Friday 8 August 1986

Fog on coast to 1,000' in AM. Warm temp. here. To hiway, to Kaye's for phone calls, shower.

Visit Doug & John; with them to Ventana for reception by BSLT & TPL regarding selling 300-400 acres to USFS. See Billy & Luci, Freeds, Rudd Crawford, etc.

Back here by 9pm.

Fog clears over much of coast in PM. Back in later.

Saturday 9 August 1986

Fog on coast to 1,000' in AM, receding a bit in PM. Fog clears for awhile in afternoon between Pfeiffer Pt. and Partington. Warm temp.

To hiway for a bale of alfalfa in PM. Back by sunset.

Sunday 10 August 1986

Fog on coast to 1,400'. SE breeze all day. Some cirrus. Hazy air. Warm in afternoon. 80's most of day. Cleared around avocados.

Monday 11 August 1986

A little cooler today. Some cirrus scattered thru sky. Fog on coast to 1,400'. Light NW breeze.

To town, collect partners' signatures, dinner with Gordon & Eleanor. Back here by 11pm.

Tuesday 12 August 1986

Fog on coast to 1,400'. Warm here.

Howard Welch, the Green Pea, signs off from the CB at 9am. Off to Carmel Valley for a month. May or may not hear him again on the radio.

Wednesday 13 August 1986

Fog on coast up to 1,400'. Warm here. To hiway to watch for tree-cutters on hiway. Meet Margaret Owings and take her home. Visit with Kaye, and later Mary Fleenor. Car dies at Post Ranch. Mike Peña fixes it by 9pm. Drinks at Kaye's, rehearsal at Vieregge's, pick up car, dinner at Barbara W's with her English friend, leave there at midnight, arrive here at 2:15am. Very thick fog, heavy drizzle on coast. Fog up to 1,800' at 2am.

Thursday 14 August 1986

Fog on coast up to 1,800-2,000' all day. South wind all day, up to 15-20 mph. Much cooler than yesterday. Wind eases up after sunset.

Friday 15 August 1986

Fog up to 2,000' at 7am, rising above cabin briefly around noon, then receding, with partial clearing around Hot Springs and McWay, then back in by 6pm. Fog at 1,900' at sunset. Mare's tails drifting in from west all day, thick in mid-afternoon. Wind variable, mostly from north, but also from south. Cool all day, with a stove fire.

Saturday 16 August 1986

Fog on coast, cirrus above, hot day.

Sunday 17 August 1986

Fog on coast, lots of nice cirrus in sky. Hot temp. all day.

Monday 18 August 1986

Clear on coast. Some nice cirrus in sky. Warm temp.

CAMP helicopters land at Madrone Flat on Partington Ridge and transport men to Pick Valley Rd. on Coast Ridge, then land 2 loads of 6 men each at Michael's Pt. 1st at 9:45, 2nd at 10:15, and I intercept 2nd group led by Dep. Hagn. He says no search warrant needed and they merely hovered, did not land. They marched down into the Partington side, crossed trail below Old Camp. Helicopters over house all day.

Tuesday 19 August 1986

Trace .03

Clear on coast. Cumulus and cirrus above. Sprinkle of rain at 8:03am, and again at 9:30am. Wind from south.

To hiway and Kaye's. Phone calls, dinner. Back here by midnight.

Found out via calls to CCMP that action of CAMP yesterday is legal.

Wednesday 20 August 1986

Trace .03

Patchy fog on coast, mostly clear in AM. Cirro-cumulus and cumulus, thick overhead, covering much of sky. Later in AM it concentrates out to sea, and a rain squall moves onshore around noon, with thunder and lightening behind it. Strikes are all out to sea. Rain off and on from noon to 1:30pm, never hard. Wind light from SE before the 3 squalls came in, then gusty to 35 mph after the squalls passed, then quiet again. Fog stampede in canyons coincident with wind gusts. Clouds break up into little puffy cumuli, and then all are gone by 5pm. Fog on coast after 6pm, to 1,000°.

Thursday 21 August 1986

Sky clear, light north breeze, fog on coast to 800'. Warmer than yesterday.

To town, meet Judith, get last signature for BSLT, talk to Brian, Zad, see Anne. Groceries, hay, then rehearsal at Vieregge's. Party for Charlotte's birthday at Goldeen's – 4 of us. Green butter. Talk to Magee at 11pm at Tin House Road gate. Back here by 2am.

Friday 22 August 1986

Fog on coast to 1,000' in AM, clearing between Partington and Pfeiffer in late afternoon, then returning by sunset. Some cirrus. Warm temp. Wind from the north.

To hiway for hay, phone. Leave here at 5:15, back by 8:15.

Saturday 23 August 1986

Fog on coast to 1,200', lowering to 800' by 1pm. Light SE breeze. Scattered cirrus. Warm temp.

Planted pineapple sage, fixed pipeline by back gate, using 2" plastic sched. 40.

Fog burns off north of Anderson, but comes back in by night. Lots of cirrus in west at sunset.

Sunday 24 August 1986

Fog on coast to 1,000', mostly south wind, sometimes from north. Cirrus above. Hazy air from fire in Hunter-Liggett. Fog burns off by noon, then patches return to 1,000' ridges by 2pm. More cirrus in afternoon, lots in west at sunset. Wind from north after 1pm, then from SE after sunset. Cool breeze from north. Fog in middle distance out to sea at sunset.

John Larmour's birthday.

Monday 25 August 1986

To hiway, phone calls at Kaye's. Partial clearing of fog in afternoon. Back here by 6pm.

Tuesday 26 August 1986

Clear on coast. To town, pick up check at Safeco, to Cachagua, grocery shopping, dinner at Kaye's with D & C, Burt, champagne. Back here by 1:30am.

Wednesday 27 August 1986

Clear on coast.

Sit in at library while Kaye meets with Panetta. More champagne with Doug & John. Back here by 9pm.

Thursday 28 August 1986

Clear on coast. A few cirrus. To hiway, and to Big Creek to view archeology sites near site of Boronda homestead south of Big Creek with Big Sur Historical Society.

Rehearsed later at Brock & Téresa's. Back here by midnight.

Friday 29 August 1986

Clear on coast, breezy up here. No Clouds above.

Saturday 30 August 1986

Clear on coast, with fog bank offshore in PM. SE breeze most of day, with north breeze later, around 5-8pm. No clouds above. Hot temp.

Sunday 31 August 1986

Fog on coast up to 800-1,000', with some clearing north of Partington in mid-day. Light north breeze in early AM, with wind picking up from SE later. No clouds above in AM.

Fog moves back in north of Partington by 6pm, and almost no wind thereafter. Cirrus mare's tails after 4pm. Fog up to 1,200' by sunset. Pretty sunset.

Monday 1 September 1986

Fog up to 1,600' in early AM, lowering to 1,400' later in day. Light breeze out of SE most of day. Clear air, warm temp. Some cirrus after 2pm.

Finished cleaning out upper floor of barn, collected stock near Jim House Spring. Also packed out ca. 100' of heavy rope from Jim House Spring.

Tuesday 2 September 1986

Fog at 1,500' in early AM. No clouds above, hazy air. Very light SE breeze.

To hiway, Kaye picks me up because van won't start. Connie Harlan picks me up at Coastlands, and to dinner at their place. Keith takes me to Grange for rehearsal, then ride south with Perry. Home by midnight.

Wednesday 3 September 1986

Fog on coast, burning off by 2pm. To hiway, met Mike Peña, who got van started. Drive to town, to vets, to airport and visit Eric at his shop. Eric drives me down coast. Back here by 1am.

Thursday 4 September 1986

Fog on coast, clear sky with some cirrus in PM. Hot temp.

Friday 5 September 1986

Fog on coast up to 1,800', burning off by 11am. To town in Kaye's car, quick shopping, etc. Talk to Eric about van. Dinner at Kaye's, back home by 11pm. Fog returns about 10pm up to Orchid Flat.

Rachel is quite ill when I get back, unsteady, bleating, not hungry.

Saturday 6 September 1986

Fog up to 2,000' in early AM, burning off by mid-afternoon. Then back before sunset. To John's for penicillin. Rachel died at 5:30pm.

Sunday 7 September 1986

Fog up to 2,000' in early AM, up to 2,400' in late afternoon, with some clearing in midday. Cool temp., north wind. Clear sky.

Monday 8 September 1986

Fog up to 2,200' in early AM, breaking up north of Big Creek, with mostly clear by 8:30, then more fog for total overcast by 9am. Light north breeze, cool temp. Clear sky, clear air.

Bring down Burrito, Rachel's son, to John, and we go to Salinas.

I walk up in 1:45, arrive at 9:30pm.

Tuesday 9 September 1986

Fog on coast in AM, clearing off by noon. Ride down at 1pm, meet Kaye and have dinner there with Charro, Toni; who drives me south afterwards. Back here by 12:30am.

Wednesday 10 September 1986

Clear on coast by mid-day, ride down, and start hitch-hiking north at 3pm. Arrive at Ripplewood at 4pm, have dinner with Kaye, then go to final rehearsal with Burt. Fog comes back in early evening. Perry takes me to Tin House Road, arrive home by 11pm.

Thursday 11 September 1986

Fog on coast up to cabin in morning, mostly at 2,000' all day. Fire in stove all day.

Friday 12 September 1986

High fog on coast, up to cabin in early AM. Settled at 2,400'. Meet Al Tyler at 10am, then catch ride to Grange for book sale preparation, dinner at Nepenthe with Judith, Katy, Charlotte, Red Tail. Then book sale, poetry reading, Indian Tales. Vandevere's were there, and many others.

Drinks at Ventana. Back here 4am – Very cold temp.

Saturday 13 September 1986

Cool temp. Clear on coast. Cirrus above and cumulus far out in west and south. Fire in stove all day. Cool north breeze.

Sunday 14 September 1986

Clear on coast, with a few patchy cumulus far out in west and south. Cumulus increase in mid-day, forming on Coast Ridge at 5-6,000'. Very cool north wind. Clear air.

Monday 15 September 1986

Clear on coast with lots of pretty cumulus above and east of Coast Ridge. Warmer today, with some south gusts coming up in PM, after north wind thru the morning. Dick Clements, Mary Anne & Carl Hooper (!) come down Agony Trail at 2:30pm to look at scenic easement and discuss court case regarding IRS. They matter-of-factly talk about Clements' plan to tear down house and barn and build 10 cabins on Michael's Ridge. Later I collect stock near Jim House Spring.

Tuesday 16 September 1986

.30 .33 30.00"

South wind. Turbulent cirro-cumulus, very dense and solid, moving in from west in early AM. Cloud layer lowers, with rainy drizzle at 10am, with ceiling at 3,000'. Rain off and on till 3pm.

Cloud ceiling lowers to cabin by noon. Then at 4pm cabin is above very uneven and beautiful fog/cumulus, which breaks up. Mostly clear at sunset, with high cirro-cumulus. Clouds off and on thru night.

Wednesday 17 September 1986

T .33

Partly cloudy in early AM, with high cirro-cumulus moving in from west. Clouds thicken thru PM, with fog, patchy, coming in. Slight drizzle around 9pm. Ceiling around 3,000' on Coast Ridge at 3pm. Total overcast after noon.

.22 in south gauge, .30 in north gauge at 8am

Leave at 5pm to meet Doug, John, Rob, Anja, for bath, dinner at Esalen. Virgo party tonight, I don't go, back here at 10pm.

Thursday 18 September 1986

Clear on coast. Cumulus above. North breeze, cool.

To hiway. Kaye picks me up, we drive to Carmel, visit David & Charro; Kaye, Charro & I have lunch at the Clock, I pick up van at airport. Expensive repair, and while parked

there my stereo and tapes were stolen. Then groceries and down coast. Arrive here at 9:45.

Friday 19 September 1986³

Tigridia blooms, first time this year.

Beautiful clear day, clear on coast, with puffy cumulus above Coast Ridge all day. Cool north breeze.

To hiway, stop at Peña's to drop off eggs, pick up newspapers, then to Boxers at Plaskett for birthday dinner at 3pm. Arrive home at 8pm.

Saturday 20 September 1986

Clear on coast, a few puffy cumulus above Coast Ridge all day. Warmer than yesterday. We hear on CB that Tani had her throat cut by hired hand, who then kidnapped her 4-year-old daughter. He was caught in SLO County. Tani will survive. Happened this AM at 2:30.

To hiway to lead history-nature walk in lower McWay Canyon for celebration of 25 years of Julia Pfeiffer Burns State Park. 11 on walk, including Tony Staude. Back here by 6:30pm.

Sunday 21 September 1986

Cool north breeze all day. Clear on coast. Puffy cumulus above Coast Ridge in AM and afternoon.

Monday 22 September 1986

Clear on coast, with puffy cumulus above Coast Ridge. Cumulus increase in afternoon, covering half of sky. Clouds are smaller at sunset, and disappear afterwards. Some south gusts, but cool north breeze most of day. Hazy air.

Cleared out wood room and started to load firewood.

Fog develops around sunset, with ceiling at 2,800', and patchy.

Read .52" in south gauge, .65 in north gauge. Mostly clear at 10am, with tall puffy cumulus coming in from north. By 11:30am, mostly overcast with cumulus, ceiling at 2,700'. North breeze. Sprinkle of rain at 11:45, over by 12:30, with .05" in south gauge. More sprinkles at 3:15pm, at 4 and 5pm. Clouds form into fog, lowering and burning off until 7pm, with sunset showing towering cumulus in far west. Clear after 9pm.

Friday 26 September 1986

Read .05 in north gauge, .06 in south gauge. Sky mostly clear, with thin broad cirrus. Clear on coast, hazy air. *Cold* temp., with light north breeze at 8am.

To hiway, collect Sulfur Shelf⁴ for Judith, meet with library group to discuss Friends of the Big Sur Library, over lunch at Nepenthe. See Ross there. To town, shopping and tune up. Back here at 9:45pm.

Cumulus clouds build up on Coast Ridge by noon, then heavy cloud front comes in from NW, darkening sky. Cold temp. here at night.

Very light breeze from SE. Read .37 in south gauge, .40 in north gauge at 9am. .35" in south gauge at 2pm. Ceiling below cabin after 2pm. Rain stops by 4pm.

Dug water bars up to corral flats, down back trail to Tin House, and up old trail to Michael's Pt. and up ridge. Clouds break up by 6pm. Nice sunset.

Sunday 28 September 1986

Read .45 in north gauge, .42 in south gauge. Clear sky, no fog. Some cirrus. Warmer temp, light north breeze. To hiway, to Pat & Elly's to see vet. He put down Elly's gelding and looked at Chink, said wart is basal cell carcinoma, must be removed. Met with "Harmony Team" at Gerards. Talked to Ewoldsens while packing hay at gate. Back here by 6:30. Gusty north wind, cool temp. at sunset.

Judith reported yesterday that Sulfur Shelf made her and Rachel G. sick.

Monday 29 September 1986

Clear on coast, clear sky, a couple of cirrus. Fog bank far out to sea in west and south. South breeze, warmer temp.

Cirrus increases, coming in from north, with south wind here until 5pm, when it comes from north. Gusting to 20-25 mph around sunset.

Tuesday 30 September 1986

Clear sky, fog bank a mile or so offshore. Some north gusts up to 15 mph. Mild temp.

To town with Kaye, tree work at David & Charro's, dinner there, beestings. Back here by midnight, with fog on coast up to 500' at 10pm.

North wind, gusty at times.

Wednesday 1 October 1986

Gusty north wind up to 20-25 mph in AM, cold temp. Sky mostly clear, with a couple of small cumulus puffs appearing over Coast Ridge after 10am. Air hazy. Fog in patches up to 2,000' at 6am, burning off later.

Cleaned up dead branches from English walnut and almond.

Thursday 2 October 1986

Clear on coast, mild temp.

Take animals to hiway by 9am to meet Pat & Elly. We take Chink to Dr. Bruce's near Hollister. He removes *squamous* cell carcinoma (not basal), does tube worming, gives tetanus injection. While there, we admire friendly 9-month old mountain lion "Sara Puma," in their captivity since 10 days old. Nice drive, etc. Back here by 8pm, walking most of the way.

Friday 3 October 1986

Clear sky, with a couple of small cumulus now and then. Hazy air. Fog on coast up to 200'. Wind mostly from the north, warmer than yesterday.

To hiway for hay, return by 7pm.

Chink a little off his feed, droopy. Wound looks OK.

Saturday 4 October 1986

Clear sky, north wind up to 10 mph, mild temp., air clearer than yesterday, fog bank far out to sea.

Chink's appetite is better.

Arthur Patterson and another guy try sneaking past house this afternoon.

Sunday 5 October 1986

Mild temp., clear on coast, clear sky, clean air. Worked on crib wall for trail above barn, put in about 20'.

Low fog rolls in from NW around mid-afternoon. Reaches McWay Canyon at 6:30pm.

Monday 6 October 1986

Clear on coast, fog bank offshore beyond Pfeiffer Pt. Some cumulus in sky. Brush fire in upper Malpaso/Soberanes Creek area in AM, burning a couple hundred acres. Drift smoke visible here. To town to finish saw work on Junipero, then visit Tani at hospital – a miracle, then meet with board of BSLT for 90 minutes.

Down the coast, dinner at Kaye's with D & C, & John Ashley, back here at 1am. Gusty, variable winds all night.

Tuesday 7 October 1986

Warm in morning, hot later. Fog bank not far offshore. Lot of small puffy cumulus. NW breeze.

To hiway to meet with board of Friends of Library at Sam & Eby's. Have dinner there, back here by 11:30.

Wednesday 8 October 1986

Fog on coast to 500'. Warm temp. here in early AM. *Hot* later. Large cumulus mass in south in early AM, receding by noon, with a couple of cumulus puffs over Coast Ridge. Light north breeze. Air hazier than yesterday.

Worked on clearing trail of brush, etc. for pack trip. Spent an hour at the big ponderosa below Michael Pt.

Thursday 9 October 1986

Foggy on coast, quite warm -70's, up here. Fog rises thru day, up to Michael Pt. by noon.

Spent another hour or so at big pine, no luck. Needs a jack.

Cooler in PM.

Friday 10 October 1986

Fog up to Tin House in early AM, then steadily rises through day. Top of fog at 2,600-2,680' at sunset.

Packed in harmony group to Michael's Pt., left Tin House Road gate at noon, arr. Michael's Pt. around 1:30-2, then packed down 20 gallons of water on Chink and 10 on Whitey. Group cleared manzanita at top of knoll for firepit. Sleeping bags everywhere.

Saturday 11 October 1986

Some sun early AM, but fog comes in and remains socked in all day. Light north breeze. Cold, drippy day, with drizzle in evening and thru night.

Packed down two 10 gallon loads of water on Whitey, then picked up bale of hay at hiway, in PM.

Fog ceiling at 1,400'.

Sunday 12 October 1986

Read .03 in south gauge at 8am.

Heavy fog in AM, surrounding cabin. Clouds peel back from Coast Ridge by noon, with sunshine by 2-3pm. Fog completely burned off by 5pm.

I have dinner with harmony group at Michael's Pt. Nice moonlight.

Monday 13 October 1986

Clear on coast, hazy air, no high clouds. Wind from the north, light. Warmer temp.

Packed harmony group out; left Michael's Pt. at 11:30am, arrived hiway at 1, met the rest at 3:30. To Doug & John's, help John, eat dinner there with them and Judith & Rob.

Tuesday 14 October 1986

Low fog on coast, hazy air, no high clouds. South wind. Mild temp.

Wednesday 15 October 1986

Fog on coast to 1,000' in AM, rising to 1,400' by sunset. Wind shifting all day from south to north. Mostly north. Very hazy air, no high clouds except for cirrus bank in far south.

Ran black plastic pipe from east corner of barn into chicken pen.

Thursday 16 October 1986

Fog just coming up to cabin in early AM, in and out thru 8am. Cold temp. Light north breeze. Lots of high cirrus. By 8:20am, fog has pulled off coast from Pfeiffer to Lopez.

To town for groceries, hay, etc. Back home by 8pm.

Friday 17 October 1986

Some thick cumulus above 4,000', burning off by 7am. South wind, cool temp. Clear on coast with thick, high cirrus. Cumulus comes in from west, moving south through AM.

To hiway at 9am, meet Red Eye at bottom of Nacimiento Rd. Go with 4th-8th graders to Cone Pk., visit Soaring Jenkins. Cumulus engulfs Cone Pk. by 12 noon, all of area east of summit with patchy cumulus as far as can be seen. Return to Coast Ridge Rd. by 2pm, house by 5pm, with most clouds burned off by 4pm. Very gusty north wind, but not too cold. All clear by sunset.

Saturday 18 October 1986

Clear on coast, some puffy cumulus on Coast Ridge in mid-day. Wind shifts from SE to north all day.

Peggy Short & Chuck walk up for visit, and I accompany them down Tin House Road, then have dinner with Pat & Ellie, and Lou Manon, at Rat Creek. Back here by 11:30pm.

Sunday 19 October 1986

Fog on coast, clear sky above. Hazy air. Wind direction varies from SE to north all day. Warm temp.

Monday 20 October 1986

High fog to 1,800', with south wind, in AM. Clear sky and very hazy air. Fog burns off by noon. Mild temp.

Tuesday 21 October 1986

Very hazy air, with gusty south wind until 10am, then light south wind. Lots of high cirrus. No fog after 9am, but occasional fog monsters in early AM.

To Kaye's, stacked a cord of Ewoldsen's oak, dinner at Kaye's, back here by 11:30pm.

Wednesday 22 October 1986

South wind all day, with low fog on coast, which burns off by 9am. Hazy air. Lots of thick high cirrus all day.

Thursday 23 October 1986

Some thick cirro-cumulus in far west in AM, with virga. South wind in AM, with north breeze in midday, picking up and cooling off before sunset. Some fog forming around Dolan Pt. in mid-afternoon, burning off later. Hazy air. Cooler than yesterday.

Very light north breeze, clear air up here, with haze on ocean. Some fog layers from north offshore. Clear sky. Mild pleasant temp.

Finished rock cribbing on trail below water tank.

Checked bees. All need feeding, except lower middle hive. Took 1 super from lower east hive and gave to lower west hive. Could extract from lower middle a few frames, or give 3 to lower west.

Wednesday 29 October 1986

Some traces of clouds from yesterday's weak storm front. Clouds burn off by noon, with clear sky, clear air, and clear on coast, in PM.

Thursday 30 October 1986

Cool temp. North wind all day, becoming quite gusty after noon. Clear sky, clean air, some fog out to sea. Cirrus after noon, with some ragged cumulus on Coast Ridge. Whitecaps on ocean.

To hiway in PM, pick up 2 bales hay, 70lbs. grain. Back at sunset. Very gusty wind late at night.

Friday 31 October 1986

Very gusty north wind off and on thru AM. Clear sky, moderate air, some thin cirrus in west, mild to cool temp. Whitecaps on ocean.

Ride to hiway in PM and pick up bale of hay, go to P.O. Back at sunset.

Saturday 1 November 1986

Warmer than yesterday, no fog, hazy air.

Re-shaped tanbark hooks for Chink.

Sunday 2 November 1986

Clear on coast, some cirrus above, but mostly clear. Wind variable, from south and north, mild temp. Rather hazy air.

Fertilized most of fruit trees with chicken manure.

Ate first ripe persimmon – one that had been pecked.

Monday 3 November 1986

Clear sky, slightly hazy air, low fog bank off Pfeiffer moves south and burns off before coming in. Light to moderately gusty wind from south. Mild temp.

Tuesday 4 November 1986

Fog on coast up to 900', although burning off by late afternoon. Warm temp. up here. Hazy air.

To hiway, check on medicine, P.O, vote, meet Judith at Pfeiffer Beach, get mussels, back here by 7:30pm.

Wednesday 5 November 1986

Warm temp., hazy air, cirrus in most of sky, fog low on coast, to 500', but burning off by mid-day. Loud fog-horn from boat all AM. North breeze all day, with some south and east breezes

Thursday 6 November 1986

Very strong gusty wind, mostly north and NE, starts at 1-2am and buffets the area until 8-9am, when it decreases to 15-20 mph. Stuff is blown all over the place, but no real damage. Big tanoak and live oak down at middle switchback on Tin House Road, but I can get thru. Pick up bale hay and Rompin⁵ for Chink from Pat D., back here by 4pm. Lots of smoke from fire at Soledad in afternoon. Ashes fall on Willow Creek and Plaskett. Wind gusty from the north, 25 mph in PM and all night. Cold temp.

Friday 7 November 1986

Some very thin high cirrus, with lots of smoke and haze from fire near Paraiso and 500 acre fire at Bottcher's Gap. Paraiso is 6,000 acres at 10am. Wind moderately gusty, 25 mph off and on until 10am, when it decreases to gentle breeze. Temp. colder than yesterday.

Saturday 8 November 1986

Gusty wind from NE and north. Cold temp. Clear air.

To hiway in afternoon, visit Kaye, P.O., and dinner with Rob & Judith. Back here by 11:30pm. Cold air.

Sunday 9 November 1986

Winds are calmer today, although gusty at times out of the north.

Fire near Soledad contained at around 5,000 acres. Bottcher's Gap fire is around 1,500 acres.

Monday 10 November 1986

Variable wind all day, up to 15-20 mph at times, from north and SE. Clear air to south, with less smoke from Little Sur than yesterday. No clouds.

Cleaned out chicken shed and disinfected with Clorox.

Tuesday 11 November 1986

Mild temp., no clouds, clear air to south. Light east or SE breeze after 8am, gusty earlier. Thick inversion layer north of Pfeiffer Pt. from Little Sur fire, which is up to 2,000 acres.

Inversion layer keeps smoke below 2,000', where temp. is much warmer – hot. Smoke moves south from Pfeiffer Pt. like a fog layer. Smoke lifts by 3pm.

To hiway, to Kaye's for work and dinner. Back home by midnight.

Wednesday 12 November 1986

Variable wind all day, from north and SE. Warm temp. Fire in Little Sur supposedly 97% contained at 2,200 acres. Some drift smoke still visible.

Wind becomes mostly SE in late afternoon, gusting to 15 mph by sunset.

Thursday 13 November 1986

Low fog to 300' on coast, moving in around 6-8am. SE breeze gusting up to 15 mph. Some cirrus in far west. Mild temp.

To hiway and Kaye's, and to town with her. Back here by 8:30pm. Followed fog layer up from hiway to cabin. Fog kept on rising, with ceiling at cabin at midnight.

Friday 14 November 1986

Thick cumulus over all of sky, rising from 2,800' to 4,000' by 10-11am. Clouds break up entirely by 3pm. Mild temp. Clear on coast, hazy air.

Up Agony Trail to meet John & Marilu and dinner at Marble Peak. Back here by midnight. Sky mostly clear, but plenty of cirrus. South wind.

Clear sky, except low cumulus in far west. Low fog offshore, moves in at 1,000' at Pfeiffer by 9am. Very clear air. Cool temp. SE wind after 9am.

Cut and hauled 10-11 wheelbarrows of madrone and oak. North breeze by sunset. Fog moves in South Coast; up to 1,600-1,800', then burns off by sunset. Some cumulus in far west and on a few ridgetops.

Thursday 20 November 1986

Clear sky, except for a few cirrus in far west. Clear air. Light south wind. Wind becomes north in afternoon and, after sunset, becomes cool and gusty to 25 mph. Cirrus in west in AM cover sky by 2pm, and cirro-cumulus move in thick in west by 4pm. Mostly all clouds cleared by sunset.

Friday 21 November 1986

After 1pm, gusty north wind picks up – to 30 mph. Clear on coast. Some high cirrus.

Split firewood in AM. Walked down to Swiss Camp in PM and checked out bench site. Walked back via Michael's Pt. and picked up stock. South wind.

Tuesday 25 November 1986

SE breeze thru most of day. Warmer than yesterday.

To Swiss Camp and split section from fallen tree Bergstrom cut for causeway. Placed splits on stones above trail for Davis' bench.

Back after sunset, clear sky with some cirrus in west. North wind thru night.

Wednesday 26 November 1986

Almost no wind, from the north. Warm temp., a couple of cirrus in south, with increasing thin cirrus in west thru AM. No fog.

To Swiss Camp, shaped bench seat. Back at sunset. North wind in evening. Clear at sunset.

Wheeled 8 loads, then split and stacked oak firewood, then went to Swiss Camp and brought back tools.

Friday 5 December 1986

.95 5.86

Read .70 in north gauge, .32 in south.

Rain, steady since at least 2:45am, sometimes moderate, sometimes light drizzle. Gusty south wind up to 25-30 mph. Wind from the north after noon, as rain decreases. No rain after 2pm. Clouds rise, ceiling at 3,000' by 2pm, on Coast Ridge by 4, clear by 7pm.

Saturday 6 December 1986

.01 5.87

Read .95 in north gauge, in south. Cold north wind in early AM. Clear sky before dawn, then high cirro-cumulus moves over from west, covering sky by 8:30am. Rain squalls off Pfeiffer Pt. at 8:30.

Light drizzle here, with shifting light breeze from 11-1 in midday. Clouds clear off later, with cold north wind and clear sky at sunset.

Judith walks up, arrives at 3pm.

Sunday 7 December 1986

FROST

Cold north wind in early AM. Light frost. Read .01" in south gauge. A few cumulus on Coast Ridge and out to sea, which move in around midday, with cold fog here a few minutes at noon. All clouds gone by sunset, with south breeze after 11am. Cool temp. all day.

Judith leaves after lunch. I get stock down by line fence.

Monday 8 December 1986

FROST

No clouds, no fog, flat ocean, very light SE breeze. Cold temp. More frost than yesterday.

To town with car. Left it at transmission shop. Dinner at Vandeveres', slides of Easter 1980 here. Back home at 1am. Cold temp.

Tuesday 9 December 1986

Quiet day here. Found out transmission is shot. \$600 to fix.

Wednesday 10 December 1986

Mild temp. Cirrus in sky all day.

Started working on madrone stump in upper terrace. Dug out, cut some roots with chainsaw, tried prying out with scissors jack. No luck.

Thursday 11 December 1986

Mild to cool temp. Mostly SE breeze in AM, becoming mostly north in afternoon, with lots of shifts. Lots of cirrus in sky, and thick cirro-cumulus from 3-5pm. Hazy air. No fog.

Finished getting madrone stump out of upper terrace! Sawed it into 6 sections and split it out with sledge and wedges.

Cut another 6-10 wheelbarrows of oak below water tank.

Friday 12 December 1986

Cold east wind, some cirrus in west. Clear elsewhere. Somewhat hazy air.

Hauled firewood, gathered stock at Jim House meadow.

Lots of cirro-cumulus in west at sunset.

Huge ring around moon.

Saturday 13 December 1986

North wind and extensive cirro-cumulus deck moves in from west in early AM. Lots of cirrus above that. Cirro-cumulus covers sky by 11am.

Walk/ride down hill, Judith drives me to Kaye's for work, dinner. Sprinkle of rain around 6pm.

Spend night at Kaye's, David drives me back 12-14.

Sunday 14 December 1986

Cold SE breeze all day. Some cumulus thickens at 2,000-3,000' from 11am thru 1pm. Cabin socked in for a brief period. Cloud clears off by mid-afternoon. More thick cirrus in west later.

Ride up hill at 9am, arrive here at 11am.

Monday 15 December 1986

Cold SE wind, thick cirro-cumulus at 5,000'+, with cumulus at 2-3,000' offshore, coming in and out on ridge here thru 10am. Sprinkle of rain at 10:30-11:30, then no rain till 1pm, when it comes down moderate to hard until 4pm. Scattered showers until 7-8pm, when clouds raise and thin out. Moonlight at 10pm.

Tuesday 16 December 1986

Some lingering cumulus patches over much of sky at 7am, clear by 9am. Cold gusty wind, from north, NE, east, SE, to 45 mph; calm between gusts. Read .41 in south gauge, .90 in north.

Got stock from just above Jim House Spring. Packed redwood up from Swiss Camp.

Wednesday 17 December 1986

Gusty east and SE wind up to 20 mph. Some cirrus in far south and west. Clear above. Mild temp. No fog, some haze.

To town, pick up van. Back here by 8pm.

Lots of cirro-cumulus at night. Ring around moon.

Thursday 18 December 1986

Gusty SE wind to 25 mph. High clouds and cloud layer at cabin level. Drizzle at 10am, then stops, then rain off and on till 3pm. Clouds lift after 10pm. South wind continues.

Friday 19 December 1986

.25

Clouds lifting, socked in at 7am, ceiling at 5,000' at 9am. Light south breeze. Total overcast at 9am, except small patch in far west.

Read .55" in north gauge, .42" in south gauge.

Walk down hill, start driving at 11am. Arrive in Pt. Loma at 8:30pm. Heavy rain thru the night in Pt. Loma.

Judith to stay here tonight and Saturday & Sunday nights.

Saturday 20 December 1986

Judith here, records .20 in south gauge, .25 in north.

Christmas with Mom, Bob, Cinnie, Pat, Joaquin, Keeli, John & Travis.

Judith transplants leeks.

Sunday 21 December 1986

Judith here.

I leave Pt. Loma at 3pm, arrive Borrego at 5:30pm.

Monday 22 December 1986

.60

8.17

Left Borrego Springs at 9am. Reached Alhambra at noon, found Palatine Dr. at 12:30, or so. Talked to woman who directed me to neighbors who knew \bar{O} 's, Mr. & Mrs. Mohs

and Mr. & Mrs. Doran; the latter remembered them well, showed me the house, 181 Palatine Dr. Tile roof, stucco, banana tree in front. Steep hilly neighborhood.

Left there 2pm, left Morro Bay in drizzle at 6:45, arrived at Vista Point at 8:30, walked up, here by 10:30pm. Heavy rain at Hot Springs, but it stopped when I parked. Clear and lifting skies as I walk up. Thin clouds, north breeze, at 10:30.

Tuesday 23 December 1986

South breeze all day, some thin high cirrus in PM. Clear sky in AM, except for a couple of lingering cumulus. Read .51" in south gauge, .60 in north.

Cirrus thicken at sunset. Thick cirrus throughout night.

Wednesday 24 December 1986

Very strong gusty wind from early AM till 8am, from north, NE and SE, up to 40 mph. Almost still after 8am. Sky covered with thin high cirrus. Some cumulus in far west in early AM. Mild temp.

Collected stock at Jim House Spring, arrived at hiway at 4:30, pick up Kaye, dinner at David's in town.

Arrive home at 2am.

Thursday 25 December 1986

South wind all day. Scattered cirrus throughout day, with some thick cirro-cumulus. Thick fog on coast, rising throughout day. Covers cabin by 3pm. I walk up Agony at 5pm, leave fog at water line trail.

Marilu meets me south of Pick Pk., dinner at Marble Peak with John & Scooter, walk back, arrive here at 1:30; 1.75 hour walk.

Friday 26 December 1986

Mild temp., clear sky, except for a few cirrus.

South wind all day.

Narcissus start blooming.

Saturday 27 December 1986

Lots of cirrus all day. South wind alternates with north wind all day.

Split firewood, got rototiller running.

Large swell on ocean.

Sunday 28 December 1986

South breeze in AM; cool in early hours, mild later. Clear on coast, thin high cirrus in south and west, large swell on ocean.

Cleared weeds/grass/brush from terraces all the way to west gate. Started clearing slope below walnut by north side of house.

Monday 29 December 1986

Swell on ocean somewhat less. Cirrus breaks up before 8am, with clear sky most of day. Warmer than yesterday.

Finished clearing brush and cleaning up bulldozer mess on north side of house.

Tuesday 30 December 1986

SE wind, thin, rather low cirro-cumulus over all of sky in AM, with ring around sun. Clouds thicken somewhat thru sunset.

To town, pay USFS water permit, dinner at Rob's with Judith, Naomi, Charlotte.

Back here by 2am, with cloud cover briefly broken.

Wednesday 31 December 1986

.03 8.20

Thick cirro-cumulus at 4,500'. North wind. Sprinkle of rain from 8:30-10am; mostly from 8:30-8:45. Clouds break up some later, with half clear sky by sunset, then thickening up again, with more drizzle at 9pm. Clouds break up 10-11pm, then another front 11-2am, but no rain.

Cluett, John Brown & sons walk down Agony. I go down with them, meet Marilu & Josie's kids coming up. We leave them at Line br., John Cluett and I go visit Blanco, then dinner at Nepenthe with John & Marilu and Browns and Alan Altree and another couple. Drive up Coast Ridge Rd. with John & Marilu, leave fog at Walter's gate. Walk down Agony at 1:20am, after champagne, etc. in car.
